PARISH OFFICE HOURS

SACRAMENTAL LIFE

It is assumed that those seeking the sacraments at Our Lady of Lourdes are members of the parish who actively participate in the parish life of the church by offering their time, talent and treasure and actively participating in liturgical celebrations.

Baptism

Four months of active church membership in the Catholic Church ..that is, regular worship attendance, supporting a parish community financially, and sharing your time/talent - is required prior to Baptism. (This does not necessarily mean Our Lady of Lourdes if you are a practicing, active Catholic transferring in from another parish community.) During the Baptismal ceremony, you, as parents, take a sacred vow to raise your child in the Catholic faith. We, at Our Lady of Lourdes, also believe in the sacredness of this vow and the Baptismal ritual, thus the requirement of four months minimum of active church membership. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is held on the first Wednesday of every other month in the Parish Center. This class is required for all first time parents. Call the Parish Office to find out the dates of classes and to pre-register. Dates and times for the baptism are arranged through the Parish Office. The ceremony is held during and after weekend masses. A signed commitment form from parents and godparents is required.

Adult Baptism

- + Contact the pastor or deacon about admission to the Church.
- + Participate in the R.C.I.A. process (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Eucharist

First Communion Procedure:

Participation in Our Lady of Lourdes' school or religious education classes in the first grade is required. First Communion is ordinarily received in the second grade. Parents are asked to participate in the program to help prepare their child for the sacrament. First Communion is usually celebrated as a group in spring. Contact the R. E. Office for further information.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) is celebrated on Saturday afternoon at 3:30-4:00 PM; on the first Thursday following the 7:30 AM Mass and other times by appointment.

First Reconciliation for Children

Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an on-going process which continues throughout the time the child is in the parish school or the religious education program. Each year an attempt is made to help the child grow in a deeper understanding and appreciation of this sacrament in accord with the child's awareness and growth. Parents are very much a part of the preparation and parent meetings are held. Parents are urged to make the celebration of First Reconciliation a family affair. The formal reception of this sacrament takes place, usually in fall, when the child is in second grade. Contact the R. E. Office for further information.

Communal Penance Service

Check the bulletin for dates and times of services held here and in area parishes.

Adult Confirmation

Confirmation for Catholic adults, 21 years or older, is celebrated at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral twice a year. A short course of preparation is required prior to this. For more information, contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation

Confirmation is usually celebrated during the junior year of high school. The persons to be confirmed are expected to:

- + attend a pre-confirmation interview
- + attend religious education classes; 10 consecutive, consistent years
- + attend candidate/sponsor meetings
- + perform church/community service
- + make a day-long retreat

Marriage

New parishioners contemplating marriage in our parish must be registered with the parish and show active participation for at least six months prior to setting a wedding date. Pre-approval of the date by the Pastor is required. A parish marriage program and participation in a diocesan pre-marriage workshop are required. Ceremonies can be scheduled anytime on Friday and Saturday no later than 1:00 PM.

Anointing of the Sick

This sacrament is for anyone who is suffering emotional, mental, or physical illness, or facing serious surgery. It is great support for the sick person to have his/her family and friends present for the sacrament. Contact the Parish Office if you would like someone anointed. In hospitals, a chaplain may be asked to administer the sacrament.

R.C.I.A.

Any adult who is not Catholic, but wishes to become Catholic, can participate in the R.C.I.A. process (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Classes are held weekly October through Easter. Contact Deacon Michael VanderBloomen for further information.

Youth Ministry

It was with great excitement and anticipation that the parish introduced a Youth Ministry program several years ago. With a vibrant and growing youth population, this program forges a strong relationship between the parish and its youth members. The program will adapt and change as more and more students become involved. Some of the present activities are: monthly meetings which explore different prayer forms, meaningful discussions and free times; Faith Factor Service Camp, Toys for Tots, benefits walks, service opportunities, retreat to the north woods and fun. PARISH SERVICES

Communion to the Sick:

If an elderly person, a shut in, a sick person, or someone unable to attend Mass would like the Eucharist brought to him or her, please call the Parish Office to make arrangements. Communion is usually brought to the homebound on the first Friday of each month.

Marian Devotions

Marian devotions have been held since 1989 and continue every Thursday. The devotions begin at 7AM with the rosary, a 7:30 AM mass followed by the Glorious mysteries of the rosary. A basket for prayer intentions is presented at the mass. Confessions are heard the first Thursday of each month immediately after Mass.

First Friday Group

Each first Friday of the month, after the 7:30 AM mass, coffee and rolls are served. All parish members are invited to attend. The social gathering is over within an hour and is a beautiful climax to the spiritual blessings that are bestowed on those who share in this celebration.

Prayer Tree

Anyone can call for prayers from the people of the parish. Parishioners volunteer to be part of the Prayer Tree network. To volunteer your services or to have an intention included, please call the Parish Office.

Children of God

This program is for children ages 4 and 5 on Sunday mornings during the 8:15AM liturgies. Two Sundays a month the children will hear the Bible stories and learn how they apply to their daily lives.

CARE Ministry

This is a way of providing a one-on-one support and listening presence to persons going through a time of transition, difficulty, grief or change in their lives. It can also be a means of companionship, especially for our people who are homebound or in care facilities. The goal is to be as responsive to our people as we can possibly be.

Meals Ministry

The Meals Ministry is a network of people who are willing to occasionally provide a meal for people and families who are coming home from the hospital, receiving treatments as out patients, ill at home, grieving, or need a break from the care taking demands of a special needs child, sibling or parent. The parish also provides a monthly meal to Freedom House. Call the Parish Office.

Religious Education Program (2010-11 school year)

Church contributions and a fee of \$105.00/child are required. The fees must be paid on the day of registration. Sacramental fees are paid when the individual sacrament preparation begins. The expectation of church contribution commitment is also required.

Non-parish tuition: \$275.00 per child; payable on registration day with pastoral permission.

Families who are financially able to contribute for the fourth and fifth child are encouraged to do so. Church contributions are a requirement of our enrollment policies. To have your child(ren) enter Our Lady of Lourdes School and/or the Religious Education program, a signed tuition/fee contract and approved schedule of payments must be followed.

PASTORAL COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES

The Pastoral Council is a consultative body of the parish community for the definition of mission and goals, for setting priorities, for the determination of policies and for the implementation of parish programs. The Council consists of eight selected members and two elected trustees, as well as one representative from each of the following: Worship, Christian Concerns, Welcoming, Activities Committees; Finance Council. The Pastor and Deacon are ex-officio members. The Council meets every other month and parishioners are welcome at all meetings.

Worship Committee

This committee shares with the priest the responsibility of providing good liturgical celebrations. It does this by establishing, developing and implementing programs aimed at meeting the spiritual needs of the parish, the family, the individual and the community.

Christian Concerns Committee

The Christian Concerns Committee involves various kinds of social outreach: including Right to Life, Christmas Giving Tree, Lenten food collections, Norbertine Peruvian Missions, Brown County Mental Health Center, Young Mothers and Babies collection, Back To School collection, work at local food pantries, as well as other forms of Christian outreach.

Activities Committee

The primary responsibility of this committee is to build and maintain a sense of community among the parishioners. They co-ordinate social, recreational and fundraising activities.

Welcoming Committee

“We are all stewards – managers of many gifts God has bestowed upon us. Our challenge as Christians is to make good use of those gifts as we pray, serve and share. It is more blessed to give than receive.” ...Acts 20:35 This committee continues to develop stewardship as a way of life in the parish through various activities and events

Parish ambassadors are assigned to new families to help mentor them in becoming familiar with the parish’s many ministries and volunteer opportunities.

Finance Council

It is the responsibility of this Council to familiarize itself with the corporate structure of the parish. It works in the administration of the parish resources of contributions, personnel, fund raising, properties, parish investments, cemetery and insurance programs. It is responsible for preparing an annual budget and evaluating its implementation. This Council is responsible for the physical condition of the parish properties. It recommends repairs, proper upkeep and improvements and implements those recommendations. The Council is comprised of the pastor, trustees, eight at-large appointed members, and the buildings and grounds resource person. The Council meets every other month.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES for LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Music

The *Lourdes Choir* usually sings two weekend masses per month, September through May. Practice is on Tuesday evenings 6:30-8:00 p.m. New members are always welcome. Contact Carol Wilda for more information (498-8020 or 336-4033, ext. 131).

The *Angelus Choir* sings several weekend masses per month. They practice one hour before Mass. Extra rehearsal time is scheduled to prepare for Christmas, Easter, and other special liturgies. The *Alleluia Attitude Family Choir* is open to preschool through adult parishioners. They practice once a week and sing several times per month although you do not need to be present for all the liturgies. If you are interested, call Susan Shefka-Peeters at 336-5124.

The *Funeral Choir* is open to all interested parishioners. Call Ginny Leidel (336-4817) or Barbara Van Deurzen (336-0316) if interested.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS (coordinated by Deacon Michael VanderBloemen)

Cross Bearers

Cross Bearers carry the cross for the processional and recessional at all weekend masses.

Mass Servers

Boys and girls in the fifth grade and higher are trained to assist the priest at Mass. Recruiting, training and scheduling takes place in September.

Lectors

Lectors are women and men who proclaim the Word of God at weekend and weekday liturgies. Training is provided by the Parish.

Communion Ministers

These ministers help distribute the Eucharist at the weekend and weekday liturgies. Each distributor is commissioned by the Bishop. One must be 25 years old.

Ushers

Ushers welcome and assist in seating the congregation, gather the collection and assist communion time, if necessary. Men and women and high school students are invited to this ministry.

Greeters

Greeters welcome parishioners as they enter the building. Families are invited to this ministry.

OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

The Rev. Blaise J. Peters, O. Praem. Scholarship Fund

The Scholarship Fund was established to recognize the accomplishments of a former pastor of St. Joseph Parish. The fund is used to assist parish families who wish to send their children to Our Lady of Lourdes School, grades K-8. If financial assistance is needed, please contact the Parish Office at 336-4033. Contributions and memorials are accepted.

Boy Scouts

The Boy Scouts organization provides a great learning and fun experience for boys. Activities include field trips, crafts, badges, nature, and first aid. The stages of Boy Scouts are: Tiger Cub (grade 1); Cub Scouts (grades 2,3,4); Webelos (grade 5), and Boy Scouts (grades 6 through high school). There is an annual Blue and Gold Banquet. Registration is in the fall.

Girl Scouts

Girl Scouts helps girls make new friends, help in the community and work on special interests. Girls K-5 are welcome to join. The stages of scouting are: Daisy Scouts (kindergarten); Brownies (grades 1-3); Junior Girl Scouts (grades 4-5). Adult volunteer leaders help guide the girls in their growth. Meetings are usually held twice a month. Registration takes place in the fall; but admission is open anytime during the year.

Quilters

Our Lady of Lourdes has a Quilters Group who meets weekly on Saturday mornings September through April. They make quilts for parish fund raisers as well as other causes and groups. Contact Peggy Soderlund for more information at 336-3354.

St. Vincent de Paul

Our local conference is based on the belief that all of us are in need of support from others, either materially or spiritually, sometime in our lives. Members visit the elderly, work at Paul's Pantry and the St. Vincent de Paul store. Various kinds of emergency assistance are offered: food, transportation, babysitting. Some families require assistance only once; however, we do have a number of families and individuals whom we serve on a regular basis. Parishioners are asked to donate food stuffs throughout the year, but especially at Thanksgiving, Christmas and during Lent. In addition, scholarship monies are provided to help defray education costs for college students. Scholarship information is available by calling the Parish Office.

Shawl Ministry

Volunteers knit or crochet a shawl for persons who are dealing with illness, undergoing medical treatment, death of a loved one, divorce, etc. It could also be given for a marriage, anniversary, birth, or adoption of a baby. As the shawl is being created, prayers are said for the person who will receive it. When completed, shawls are brought to a monthly meeting and each minister prays over the shawl. OUR LADY OF LOURDES CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Our Lady of Lourdes School currently houses pre-school through eighth grade. An academic curriculum is offered with an emphasis on Catholic values and tradition. In addition, students in grades five through eight have the opportunity to participate in an extracurricular athletic program which offers soccer, volleyball, football, basketball, track and cheerleading. An instrumental and voice music program is also offered at Our Lady of Lourdes. Families are asked to contribute tuition in addition to parish stewardship. Financial assistance is available through the Rev. Blaise J. Peters, O. Praem Scholarship fund, Mendikow Scholarship Fund and parish financial assistance programs. The school operates under the guidance and direction of the Our Lady of Lourdes Site Advisory Board, which is the policy making body for the educational programs in the parish. The School Site Advisory Board receives their authority from the corporation officers "to make decisions in the spirit of the mission of the parish and in the context of the goals established by the School Board." OUR LADY OF LOURDES RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

The program is administered by the Director and Coordinator working with catechists from the parish and St. Norbert College. Classes for grades 1-5 are held early evenings on Wednesdays from September through April. Grades 6-11 meet on Wednesday evenings and are scheduled in blocks at different times throughout the school year. Regular attendance at these classes is required for anyone wishing to be confirmed in grade 11. Families are asked to pay the established religious education fees in addition to parish stewardship. Financial assistance is available through the parish assistance program. At all levels, there is a strong emphasis on scripture and prayer besides the basics of the Catholic tradition. Music, films, videos and a variety of activities enhance the program texts. Students' learning abilities on each level are considered and a full curriculum is set up to ensure that students will cover a variety of topics over the years of their religious education. Lessons emphasize a message about faith and teach children to apply that message to everyday life so that the religious becomes a lived response to God in their daily actions.
